What was your first role after graduating? Generalist therapist working with adults in an acute setting, children in community clinics and young people at a special school.

How did you progress from your first role to your current job? I developed a specialist area (bilingual children) and then began to undertake research. I investigated higher qualifications and found excellent tutors who inspired me to sign up for a PhD. My current work with trans people was because I had the skills and offered to help.

When I started my voluntary work I used my CPD skills to find out more about the client group , meeting other therapists at a Clinical Excellence Network.
