






Change in the Child: Torfaen








Change in the Environment: Torfaen

Bridgend

- In 2015, the Bridgend Flying Start Speech and Language Therapists won an NHS Wales award for their work in reducing language delay in two and three year olds
- The Speech and Language Therapists worked with FS nurseries in Bridgend to achieve a significant reduction in the number of children with delayed language skills
- Out of over 600 children screened on starting nursery, 73% were assessed as having significant language delay, which would impact on future learning development
- After the interventions delivered by nursery staff which were planned and supported by the Flying Start Speech and Language Therapists, 68% of the children with the worst language delay had improved (see poster)

Blaenau Gwent

•Blaenau Gwent's data is in line with the national data on language skills of children who live in deprived areas, with 53% of children identified as experiencing difficulties with their language development.

•Almost ¾ of those engaged in the Elklan 'Let's Talk with your Baby' programme scored green. Compared to those that hadn't attended, those that did were twice as likely to have a green outcome.


Be Here Be Clear: preventing early language difficulties

A collaboration between Speech & Language Therapy, Health Visitors and Action for Children

•Strong emphasis on co-production and involving Dads •4 sessions, delivered at home, in which each parent is filmed with their child and then supported to choose a relevant target (e.g. Getting face to face; following the child's lead)

Why SLT In Neonatal Care?

 Babies born prematurely are at increased risk of *feeding* and *early communication difficulties*, due to being born early or having complex medical conditions that affect their *neurology* and functioning of the oral and pharyngeal structures required for sucking and swallowing




- 1800 premature births in Northern Ireland annually
- These infants require early support for survival, long term development and improved health outcomes
- As dysphagia associated with increased morbidity and mortality, early identification of those at risk is important

Developmental Care- SLTs support this as part of wider team, to encourage family centred care; reduce environmental stressors e.g. noise, light; encourage bonding- skin to skin (helps milk production) and parents' voices; positive touch to reduce aversions




